AFRICAN HOLY NIGHT

/Smith, R. (ME) • 49156

O Holy Night has been re-imagined in a completely different setting. Featuring the percussion section, we are musically transported to the Serengeti and jungles of Africa to explore the well-known melody in both time and texture.

CARILLON ON FOREST GREEN

Peery (ME) • 49157

A beautiful orchestral version of this wonderful English folk tune that is so closely associated with the Advent season.

FIELD DAY

Bernotas (ME) • 30342

Your students will have a field day filled with fun as they perform this exciting overture! This piece works perfectly for string orchestra or with added winds and percussion. A fantastic piece for your students' first full orchestra experience.

GOD REST YE MERRY, GENTLEMEN

/Davis (ME) • 57201

This highly original adaptation of the English carol will make a welcome and unique addition to your holiday program. Scored in string-friendly keys of G and D, this work presents no severe technical issues.

VIVID

Sciaino (ME) • 49147

Ajoyful celebration of life and all of the bright and deep shades that enhance our world as communicated through the endless sonic colors of a full orchestra setting. The music seeks to find vitality and strength while exploring concepts of clarity and vibrancy. This selection offers younger students a vehicle to experiment with the concept of taking music beyond the page.

AMERICAN CHRISTMAS FOLK SUITE /Holcombe (M) • 12660

A medley of early African American hymns including *Rise* Up Shepherd and Follow, Brightest and the Best (Star in the East), and Go Tell It on the Mountain.

BUFFALO RIVER SUITE: Beating the Rapids Woodruff (M) • 57204

A spirited, almost fiddle-like tune begins our journey down the river, with cascading 8th notes in each section. The drama builds with a modulation to D, with figures representing the whitewater rush. The G major section returns, leading to another modulation to C and a beautiful viola solo, backed by the other principal strings. The entire orchestra plays the romantic and restful theme with our successful trip down the river to camp.

CHRISTMAS AT THE SYMPHONY /Story (M) • 30343

A medley of three classical holiday tunes: Mozart's *Sleigh Ride, German Dance No.* 3, Tschaikowsky's *The Nutcracker*, and Bizet's *March of the Kings*. This arrangement is playable by string orchestra alone or with any number of added winds or percussion.

ELIZABETHAN CAROL

Brown/Davis (M) • 57202

This charming and harmonious arrangement remains in the key of G throughout.

FANTASTIC BEASTS: The Secrets of Dumbledore, MUSIC FROM

/Bernotas (M) • 12662



The magic and mystery of this installment of J.K. Rowling's adventure will come to life with this exciting arrangement. This arrangement can be performed as a string orchestra alone or with winds and percussion up to a full orchestra. Featuring these highlights from the score: The Secrets of Dumbledore, Lally, Countersight, The

Room We Require, and Hedwig's Theme.

THE HIGHLAND GAMES

Dudinsky (M) • 49155



A heroic and daring piece that draws inspiration from the annual Highland Games in Scotland. A Gaelic tune is passed through different sections and is followed by a building secondary theme. This brings the piece to new heights in a flowing legato section, depicting the breeze blowing through the lush grass of the Scottish Highlands.

The primary theme returns in different variations for an epic closing to this gallant piece. It will help players practice ostinato and play quick melodic patterns.

KING OF HEARTS Simmons (M) • 57203

This work composed in sonata-allegro form moves back and forth between dance and processional moods with stately themes and transparent orchestral colors.

KRISANNA'S COLORS: Red, Mvt. I Smith, R. (M) • 49148

The suite, *Krisanna's Colors*, is inspired by color choices used to describe her daily emotions and moods. Beginning with somber clarinet solo and choir, the mood quickly changes to bombastic with extreme energy, as a red day was extremely energized and fierce.

KRISANNA'S COLORS: Blue, Mvt. II Smith, R. (M) • 49149

A blue day was sad and reflective. Beautiful harmonic changes rooted in American jazz. With its poignant melody this a rich educational experience on many levels.

KRISANNA'S COLORS: Yellow, Mvt. III Smith, R. (M) • 49150

A yellow day was bright and cheery. A delightful and energetic selection for concert and festival performance. The infectious melody is presented throughout the orchestra, including a fugue statement.

KYIV, 2022 Balmages (M) • 71000



Written as a powerful sequel to *Moscow*, 1941, this work changes the narrative. The theme from Moscow now becomes the aggressor, and the heroic people of Ukraine are represented by the Ukrainian National Anthem and the powerful song *Prayer for Ukraine*. Certain to spark discussions about humanity, history and culture, this piece

can easily be performed alongside *Moscow*, 1941 for band.

A MOTHER'S HYMN

/Smith, R. (M) • 49151

Simple, poignant and beautiful, this piece is an artistic experience for both the orchestra and audience. Based on an old Swedish melody, *How Great Thou Art*, this setting is appropriate for any concert or festival performance.

PAT-A-PAN

/Heinecke (M) • 49152

This sprightly arrangement of the well-known French carol imagines shepherds playing their primitive instruments as they celebrate news of a baby born in Bethlehem. What begins as whispers from the flute and drum grows as word spreads and a fugue-like melody bounces between instruments. The song builds to a powerful climax as the shepherds gather and march down from their pastures together.

SLAVONIC DANCE IN C, OP. 46, NO. 7 Dvorak/Meyer (M) • 33205

Faithful to the original, this arrangement retains the bold and brilliant orchestration with exciting and meaningful parts for every instrument. Your students and audience will love the immediately appealing melodies, the delightful shifts from major to minor modes, and the imaginative canonic effects that permeate this work.

ZADOK THE PRIEST

Handel/Wagner (M) • 30344

The first of Handel's four *Coronation Anthems*, has been a cherished part of British coronation services since 1727. It is a magnificently resplendent work that embodies the essence of British pride and spirit. This terrific arrangement encapsulates the majesty of the original.

AMERICAN SUITE

Holcombe/Holcombe, Jr. (MD) • 12741



Westward Ho opens with a declarative fanfare leading the listener to a broad outdoor melody in the horns over an exciting rhythmic ostinato. Morning is the central movement in a simple ternary form, building towards beautiful bi-tonal harmonies. The middle section is based on a simple song-like melody, then recalls the simple opening

statements, reminiscent of the gradual dawning of a new day. The final movement, *Celebration*, is jovial with the main themes from the earlier movements momentarily superimposed.

CADENCE EVERLASTING Galante (MD) • 30341

This piece begins with a solo horn accompanied by sustained strings, setting the tone for this lyrical piece. This work aims to capture humanity's love affair with music. The beauty of music is its ability to evoke an emotional response without words, just sonic waves. Music truly is the sound of emotions.

CLOWNS Woodruff (MD) • 38117



A tribute to the American Circus and the many different clowns and clown acts that have graced the Big Top for generations. It features a variety of captivating themes which allows the imagination to have fun!

FALLINGWATER Parsons (MD) • 49154

Inspired by the famous architectural masterpiece and its

foundational waterfall, this piece depicts a day in Mill Run, Pennsylvania from first sunrise to the final glimmer of twilight. Sparkling orchestral colors shimmer like windswept leaves, while majestic, soaring thematic material surges along with the flowing river. Explore nature's captivating beauty with this exciting new work!

OLYMPUS CALLS Parsons (MD) • 49153

This dynamic concert opener features the atmosphere of a stately processional. Based on both the concept of the Olympic games and the Olympians of Greek mythology, this piece features the heraldry and majesty of Mt. Olympus calling out from on high as mighty heroes heed the summons and assemble. Brilliant fanfare flourishes and the thunder of percussion capture the drama and triumphant victories echoing throughout the ages.

OPENING NIGHT Balmages (MD) • 71001



This original Broadway-style overture is full of energy and will transport audiences to the world of musical theater. The curtain comes up, the spotlight turns on, and the magic begins as the show finally reaches its Opening Night. In addition, there are numerous instrumentation options. Perform the piece with traditional full orchestra, or

combine your band and string programs to bring the house down!

ROB ROY

Berlioz/Neidhold (MD) • 57205

This is a fantastic introduction to the incredible music of Berlioz and an opportunity for students to learn how to navigate the abrupt twists and turns in melody, harmony, and form. This arrangement strives to give all instrument sections challenging and enjoyable music to learn and perform.

THE STAR-SPANGLED BANNER Smith/O'Loughlin (MD) • 34001

A brief opening and closing fanfare was added to set the stage for the tone and grandeur of the music. Throughout the arrangement, each section gets the opportunity to play the melody while adding some interesting colors to support the iconic anthem. It is instantly majestic and celebratory in nature and a fitting tribute to our great nation.

THREE MARCHES FOR PIANO DUET, OP. 45: March No. 1 in C

Beethoven/Clark (MD) • 57200



This march in C major begins with a stately melody with dotted-note rhythms, which is shared between the winds and strings. No section is ignored in the orchestration, every instrument has a chance to play thematic material. The lyrical trio features melodic solo woodwinds with the accompaniment in the strings. The march is delicate and

delightful, with that melodic winsomeness only the best composers can achieve. This would make a wonderful concert opener with its bright tempo, colorful harmonies, and happy mood.

WATER REFLECTIONS Nishimura (MD) • 34002

The gorgeous melodies feature harmonic depth and rich textures. Lush interplay between winds and strings is enhanced with stately percussion, timpani, and optional harp. The gentle opening melody leads to a faster, joyful middle section that eventually returns to the original lyrical theme.

(UP)LIFTED

Balmages (D) • 71002

This uplifting, overture-style work will immediately entrance your audience with the opening's rapidly unfolding colors and textures. It combines glorious fanfares and sweeping lyrical lines in music that will inspire everyone in the concert hall.



A CAN-CAN FESTIVAL Offenbach/Parrish (E-MD) • 34003



In this arrangement, both new and experienced students get to enjoy the excitement of Offenbach's famous dance. The piece can be performed with strings only, with parts for beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels. Or, add optional advanced wind, brass, and percussion parts for a full orchestra concert. The perfect grants

finale to your pyramid concert that will motivate young musicians with a great sense of pride and accomplishment!

STRING ORCHESTRA

Easy

ACCOLADE Guarrine (E) • 58660

This piece showcases newly learned skills, using mostly unison rhythms, stepwise motion, and simple quarter and half note rhythms within the range of the D major scale. Violin 2 doubles viola, and cello doubles bass to build confidence in playing independent parts.

ACROPOLIS

Putnam (E) • 66727

This work is a great introduction to simple syncopation. Using only notes of the D scale, it also has a great opportunity to introduce simple slurs and legato playing.

ANTELOPE FREEWAY Rosenhaus (E) • 37876

A charming new work for young string players! The title is both captivating and a little puzzling, but just like the music itself - will keep them coming back for more!

BLACK HOLE Neidhold (E) • 68777



Beware the black hole! This fun and dramatic piece is perfect for beginning ensembles. All sections get to play the minor melodies, and with too many opportunities to play in the rests, students will furiously count to avoid playing in a black hole. An optional accelerando at the end emphasizes the inescapable gravity of a black hole.

CELLOS IN CHARGE! Siegler (E) • 68774

In this uplifting piece, your beginning cello section gets a chance to shine! The cello section plays first, introducing the main theme for the other sections and then introduces the changing rhythms as the piece develops. The piece is based on the very first notes your beginners are learning and would be perfect for a first-year concert. Let your cellos take the lead!

CHRISTMAS STARS /Clark (E) • 37906

This easy medley is a masterful mashup of familiar carols and holiday songs. Your students and audience will enjoy this engaging and entertaining combination of familiar music.

CHRISTMASTIDE /Arcari (E) • 66725



This title only uses the first six notes of the D scale to combine, in quodlibet, four classic carols into a delightful setting for the youngest of orchestra musicians. Your first-year students will shine as they delight audiences with *I* Saw Three Ships, Patapan, in Dulci Jubilo, and Deck the Halls.

DARK MATTER Taurins (E) • 44557

Strong from the start, this piece will engage the students with bold sounding minor music. It has the flavor of action movie music but for beginning students. This piece will come together in a hurry, and students will love playing it again and again!





Easy (cont.)

DRAGON CHASE LaBrie (E) • 52619

Who doesn't love an exhilarating, one-octave, E-minor tune about Dragons?! Driving rhythms and melodies echoing from section to section will engage your students. Musical elements---such as marcato, accents, crescendos, and bow lifts---make it an excellent teaching piece. The first violin part includes carefully placed low 2s on the A string, while the other sections stick mainly to a 6-note range.

ECLIPSE

Neidhold (E) • 58667

This easy-to-learn rock-style tune will energize your orchestra and introduce improvisation in a fun setting! With a flexible score including optional violin 2, piano, and drum set, your students can achieve a big, impressive sound. The improv section includes a notated solo option in every part, or students can improv while the rest of the orchestra vamps in the background.

FIRST STAR

Taylor (E) • 58662

This accessible introduction to 3/4 time offers young ensembles the opportunity to explore basic rhythms, easy voice independence, and notes on the D, G, and A strings with no low-two finger patterns. Pizzicato and simple staccato add sparkle to this elegant theme with subtle hints of the familiar "twinkle" melody.

FLOATING IN A DREAM

Day (E) • 68778

Close your eyes and imagine you are floating while you are dreaming, best accomplished with the help of a beautiful melody accompanying the dream. This piece uses legato style bowing and should feel relaxed and unhurried. Students should keep a steady pulse, especially when playing pizzicato. Each section has a turn playing the melody - see if the students can tell when they have the melody line. With easy rhythms, some cello divisi, this is a great piece for working on tone production!

G STREET ROCK LaBrie (E) • 71501



Get ready to rock! And improvise! And learn notes on the G string! This piece promotes both music literacy and creativity. A four-bar vamp allows students to improvise or perform suggested solos. A "Guide to Improvisation" is included on the back of each student part, along with sample solos, and the score includes a lesson

plan with sequential steps to teaching improvisation. An optional drumset part adds even more excitement!

A HOLIDAY REMIX

/Griesinger (E) • 58661

Mix it up for a fun first winter concert! This mash-up of familiar holiday tunes uses only quarter and half notes from the D major scale with no shifting in the bass. Melodies include Joy to the World, Jingle Bells, Deck the Halls, Good King Wenceslas, and Jolly Old St. Nicholas.

I SPY

LaBrie (E) • 71502

This engaging work becomes a secret agent soundtrack as students spy around corners, sneak stealthily like ninjas, and burst out in surprise attacks. It uses a wide range of dynamics and styles, including staccato, pizzicato, and accents. A fun work with a truly cinematic feel!

ICICI ES

Parrish (E) • 58663

Feel the frigid chill of winter winds and brittle ice! This contemporary sounding work features guarter and half note rhythms in basic stepwise motion. Cello and bass sections have prominent lines and all notes fall within the range of the D major scale. Close (yet easy) intervals create interesting harmonies that hint at dissonance to represent the bitter cold of frozen ice.

INTO THE MIDNIGHT FOREST Rogers, M. (E) • 68775

This piece is a perfect selection for a string orchestra's first concert! Using only quarter notes and half notes in B minor, the composition has a "mysterious march through the darkness" feel that students will enjoy playing. Easy bowings, limited range, and a viola part that doubles violin 2, this work will make a first-year orchestra sound marvelous.

IT'S RAINING CATS AND DOGS Koller (E) • 68776



It is based on a familiar old joke: "When it is raining cats and dogs, be careful you don't step in a poodle!" The simple melody uses only the notes of the D major scale on the D and A strings. It begins with pizzicato raindrops and of course later includes "barking" and "meowing." Each section gets a chance to try both techniques and each section

gets the melody. An optional idea that would no doubt improve intonation, would be to have the kids sing the melody acapella while playing the easy raindrop accompaniment.

JERUSALEMA (Master KG) /Moore (E) • 39730



With over 300 million views, this South African song is one of the most popular videos on YouTube! This D major string orchestra arrangement by Larry Moore perfectly captures the infectious ostinato rhythms combined with the smooth melodic lines of the original. It's sure to be a big hit with both your students and audience!

JINGLE OLD ST. NICK! /Blair (E) • 37895



Using just the first six notes of the D major scale this clever medley is an ideal choice for your first holiday concert. Everyone gets a moment in the melodic spotlight with the familiar carols Jolly Old St. Nicholas and Jingle Bells.

MARCH OF THE REALM Donahoe (E) • 37908

This piece uses a satisfying blend of dynamic contrasts and articulation variations to create a wonderful way for young musicians to play with independent parts. A great way to open a concert!

MYSTIC FIRE Griesinger (E) • 58664

An adventurous concert experience for developing orchestras, this piece uses familiar notes on the D and G string, doubling violin 2 with viola and cello with bass. Easy whole notes and staccato patterns reinforce techniques and rhythms learned in the classroom as students get to practice independent counting. Set in string-friendly E minor, the mysterious theme gives all sections the opportunity to shine.

NIGHTWATCH

Ford, C. (E) • 58665

With intense energy, this piece depicts the daring determination of protectors who keep watch in the night. The engaging music reinforces foundational rhythms and techniques, including staccato and changing dynamics. Violin 2 doubles viola and cello doubles bass with optional piano for support as every section gets to play the melody.

NOT ALL WHO WANDER... Sluder (E) • 40912

This beautiful and contemplative piece encourages exploration and self-discovery. Written in D major, the piece features a smooth, connected bow throughout and opportunities for cello and bass harmony. The pizzicato section adds an extra touch of warmth and depth to this love song to wandering.

PERILOUS Clark (E) • 44565





Perilous – full of danger or risk describes the type of piece created for the youngest of string players. The piece uses only the first 6 notes of the D major scale but it is aggressive and energetic. Students will enjoy the strength of the piece and the cinematic nature of the music.

THE PIRATE'S APPRENTICE Neidhold (E) • 66728

Ahoy Ye Mateys! Your beginning string players will love this pirate inspired piece written in dramatic E minor. The lilting 3/4 time will have your musicians and audiences dreaming of adventure on the high seas. You will be glad you selected this fun and motivational piece for your students.

PIZZICATO HOLIDAYS /Bernotas (E) • 52626

The gorgeous harmonies and wistful melodies of I'll Be Home for Christmas come alive in this endearing arrangement. This amazing setting of the holiday classic is quite playable yet with such a mature sound that this arrangement would be at home with any level orchestra. Stunning, powerful, and forever memorable.

PLAYGROUND GAMES Ford, C. (E) • 52618



Playgrounds are full of children having fun together. No matter their background, the laughter and shrieks of joy are the same as they run and play. This piece is a playful musical portrait of this experience. In the first section, the children gather for their game as the melody is supported by building rhythmic energy. The second section

depicts another game in a round. Finally, it's time to go home, but only after one quick moment to finish! This piece uses only the notes of a D major scale and simple rhythms. Parts are doubled in violin 2/viola and cello/bass.

POINT FIVE

Estes, L. (E) • 66726

Your students will think the title is intriguing, but it basically says what it is, a dynamic new composition for the least experienced players.

RACE TO THE RIVER

Rogers, M. (E) • 68779

Based on a pivotal moment in the Revolutionary War, this piece allows young strings students the opportunity to play music that portrays elements of this historic event. The marching of troops, the skirmishes between the two armies, and the arrival at the river are all described musically.

ROOK TO BISHOP

Parton (E) • 67597

This piece is written to showcase the musicianship of the beginning orchestra. Using only quarter notes/rests, half notes/rests, and the pitches D, E, F-sharp, G, A, and B, it allows each section an opportunity to play the melody. This delightful piece sounds more challenging than it is.

SHARP ATTACK!

Arcari (E) • 66729

Make every week sharp week with your beginning string students. Use this fun teaching piece to help students remember their sharps! Every sharp is clearly indicated to reinforce how accidentals come before the note. The key of B minor brings intensity to the work and adding the optional household percussion only enhances the excitement.

SPEED FORCE

Phillips (E) • 36643

Feel the momentum and excitement in this very easy piece that will come together nicely! All sections get a chance at the guarter note melody and the repeated eighth-note pattern that drives the work. Spark a challenge to see if the orchestra can play faster than the director can conduct! Correlated to Sound Innovations for String Orchestra, Book 1, Level 4.

SPIDERS ON THE LOOSE

Day (E) • 68780

Students will love this easy piece which portrays spiders insidiously creeping and crawling up their arms, represented by eighth notes. Each section gets to play the exciting melody and develop their skills in the key of E minor, including low C-naturals. Please observe the crescendo starting as the spiders crawl up the arm and reach the neck (screaming at is permitted with the forte)! This is a great piece for reinforcing counting and playing eighth notes evenly.

STROLLING

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Hinds (E) • 37880

Take your young string performers on a musical stroll with this new, very easy piece. An excellent choice for a first concert as well as being a great piece to use for teaching form.

THROUGH THE PINES Sluder (E) • 40913



BEGINNING STRING SERIES A gentle and uplifting piece that will transport your young ensemble to a peaceful forest of pine trees. With its use of guarters, halves, and dotted halves, this piece serves as a perfect introduction to 3/4 time for your students. The smooth and connected bowing style, along with the interactions between the different parts, will help

your students develop their ensemble skills while enjoying the rejuvenating experience of a walk in the woods.

TREE TOP DREAMS Neidhold (E) • 57790

With a sprinkle of childhood imagination and a sweep of allgrown-up ensemble sonority, students will love playing this piece. Playable at the first-semester concert, each section plays melodic material, and basic string crossings are emphasized.

TROIS DANSES ROYALES Dupuis (E) • 44571

This enjoyable work for beginning string orchestra is a short three movement suite reminiscent of music from the Renaissance

TWO MINUTE NOODLES

Fin (E) • 48614



Just add...strings! This uncomplicated work is designed to teach elementary concepts of bowing, pizzicato, lifted bows, and dynamics. It uses eight basic rhythms in common time. The use of rhythmic unison means that all parts can be taught quickly and simultaneously, making this piece ideally suited to a concert that occurs

very early in the term or in a period of time where there may be interrupted weeks at school. Short and sweet, it goes for exactly---two minutes!

THE VIBES OF VISBY

Cunalata (E) • 44573

This charming piece for the youngest of students uses only the first 6 notes of the D scale and will give students a sense of success right from the start!

AIR WARRIORS Donahoe (ME) • 36651

With driving bass lines and sweeping melodies, this piece captures the warrior ethos of our many service members and veterans of the United States Air Force. Students will love the rhythmic drive of the low string parts, and all performers get a chance to shine in the melodic sections. Written by a USAF veteran (and veteran orchestra director), this piece is a great way to honor the veterans in your community!

ALKALINE Arcari (ME) • 66732



Alkaline takes an ironically less "basic" approach in this accessible work. The introduction features a clever ostinato pattern that will transport you to the cinema. There are great parts for the basses and cellos, as well as a lush harmonic section!

Written as a follow-up to Acidic #66661,

ALLEY CAT STRUTTIN' Samuel/Neidhold (ME) • 66740

Taken from the original version for jazz ensemble this arrangement is a bluesy, swinging chart with lots of tutti rhythms making this an excellent choice for a young ensemble just starting on the path to jazz.

ALL-STAR FIDDLES

Davis (ME) • 37932



Your students will have a great time with this rollicking new composition. It is also a fantastic way to reinforce eighthquarter-eighth syncopation. Your whole ensemble will be all stars with this funfilled piece.

ANCIENT SCOTTISH AIR /Bedford (ME) • 58676

This plaintive tune was made famous in the film The Piano. This arrangement offers young players an introduction to the rich breadth of Scottish folk music with a lilting dotted melody that is fun to play. With pizzicato and staccato accompaniments, this lyrical melody is passed around to every section of the orchestra.

ASCENSION

Gelfer (ME) • 58666

Take your orchestra on a soaring journey with upward rising phrases in this original work. All sections explore the key of B minor with no extended finger patterns in this exciting theme. The first violin section ventures into notes on the E string and all students will get to practice easy hooked bowing.

ASTRAL

Morales (ME) • 41646



Where does the magic found in fantasy worlds come from? This power comes from among the stars, the astral plane. Written to represent mystical powers that are present in so many stories, this piece hopes to take you on a journey to the many battles fought between light and darkness using magic. Featuring legato bowing and slurs mixed with

driving rhythms to keep the music moving forward, all instruments share the responsibility of carrying melodic material throughout the piece. Cellos have a soli section that leads into a lush textured retelling of their melody by the whole orchestra. First violins have a descant section in third position that is written as an introduction to shifting.

AXIOM

Clark (ME) • 66733

An axiom is a statement or proposition which is regarded as being established, accepted, or self-evidently true. Make your orchestra sound mature with this bold piece that includes fanfare gestures, strong themes, and contrasting lyrical music.

BABA YETU

Tin/Longfield (ME) • 39686



The well-known melody from the video game Civilization IV is exquisitely captured in this G major arrangement. Based on a Swahili translation of the Lord's Prayer, this arrangement is simplified enough to make it accessible while retaining the intricate rhythms of the original. Your students will love playing this infectious tune, which was

the first piece of video game music to receive a Grammy!

BABY SHARK

/Moore (ME) • 39650

Just when you thought it was safe to go back into the water, this string orchestra arrangement surfaces! Beginning with a clever allusion to the original theme from Jaws, this version of the traditional campfire song gives your students a chance to relive memories from their younger days! Beginning in G major, this cut-time arrangement modulates to A major and closes with another snippet of the Jaws theme.

BONES (Imagine Dragons) /Lopez (ME) • 47886

Give your students and audience a special treat with this outstanding arrangement - crafted so it is easy to learn and teach. This piece has all the elements of a top-notch pop tune.

BRITISH ISLES TRAVELOGUE /Lentner (ME) • 57786



This piece features a folksong from each of the four UK countries. *The Ash Grove* from Wales highlights first and second violin harmonies, followed by the lively English *Morris Dance*. In *Blue Bells of Scotland*, each section has its chance to shine, accompanied by the droning bagpipe fifths in the other parts. The Irish *Sailors' Hompipe* leaves

listeners ready to dance a jig and sends the more advanced violins to third position.

CANON NOEL

/Monday (ME) • 58669

Canon Noel combines the iconic Pachelbel theme with graceful melodies from *The First Noel* and *Hark! the Herald Angels Sing.* This lyrical setting in D major includes just a little shifting in the bass and easy high-3 finger patterns in violin 2 and viola. Simple scale-based motion and frequent doubling will give the developing ensemble a full, rich sound as all sections get to play melodic material.

A CANTERBURY CHRISTMAS /Griesinger (ME) • 58674

Experience a storybook Christmas with this medley of old English carols. Beginning in 4/4 time, *Good King Wenceslas* meets 12 Days of Christmas before violas sing O Come, O Come Emmanuel under a pizzicato refrain of God Rest Ye, Merry Gentlemen. A turn to 3/4 meter brings garlands of Deck the Halls intertwined with The Holly and the lvy before all parts converge for an joyful rendition of I Saw Three Ships in a festive finale.

CAROL OF THE SHEPHERDS

/Lentner (ME) • 57787

The spritely Bohemian carol gives first violins a chance to play in third position, and celli also have some fun stretches. The mood here is light and dance-like.

CAROUSEL DREAMS

Donahoe (ME) • 66730



This delightful waltz gives your performers and audience the feeling of a lovely ride on an old-time carousel. As you circle around, the carousel horse gently moves up and down to the soothing music. The piece then moves to a melancholy theme as the ride comes to an end.

CELTIC AIR AND DANCE /Sweeney (ME) • 39716

This toe-tapping medley of two traditional Scottish songs (*The Parting Glass* and *Fairy Love Song*) will soon have your audience clapping along!

CHRISTMAS IN BRANDENBURG /Clark (ME) • 66734

Imagine if Bach decided to infuse popular Christmas carols into the fabric of his famous *Brandenburg Concerto No.* 3. That is the idea behind this arrangement, to seamlessly meld together the popular carols by arranging them in the style of this famous Bach work.

COLLIDING FATES Grant (ME) • 71505

Full of action and drama, this piece will keep your students and audience on the edge of their seats! Driving ostinati are coupled with sweeping melodies and exciting harmonies to create tension and momentum.

COOK STRAIT CROSSING Estes. L. (ME) • 66739

Based on a true story from New Zealand, this is an ideal piece for historical lesson plans, as well as for contest and festival performance. Students will learn from – and love it.

DANCE OF THE SPRITES Clark (ME) • 66736

Sprites are imaginary creatures such as elves, pixies, imps, or fairies. Imagine these tiny little creatures having a joyous time frolicking and dancing about. This enjoyable little tune is contrasted by a lush and lyrical B section – stunning!

DARK IMPERIUM

Fryklund (ME) • 58678

Experience an imperial work that smolders with a stately intensity, marching forward with a precise and forceful energy. Set in A minor and 2/4 time, engaging melodic figures unfold with unflinching focus while progressing through sometimes-unexpected harmonies. Students will encounter easy accidentals in first position and interesting counterpoint between the sections as the piece builds to a powerful conclusion.

DARK STAR RISING Terry (ME) • 37909

The driving rhythm and bold E minor harmony of the opening section contrasts beautifully with the lyrical and sweeping B section. The main theme returns to lead to a dramatic ending. Great for showing off the dynamic reaches of your orchestra.

DOVETAIL

Arcari (ME) • 66735

As the title suggests, the lyrical thematic material effortlessly dovetails from one section of the piece to the other. The melodic material is lush and flowing while the pizzicato accompaniment gives contrast and forward momentum that makes this work feel so right.

DYNAMIC FORCES

LaBrie (ME) • 44558

This piece launches into thematic material from the start without introduction. This energetic and rhythmic composition is exciting from start to finish.

EAGLE SOARING Holmes (ME) • 37975



The opening energetic eighth-note pattern of the upper strings provides the perfect backdrop for the soaring melody of the cello and bass sections. The tempo remains constant throughout as the pulsating rhythm of the opening theme is passed from section to section. This would be a powerful way to begin or end a concert.

ELIJAH: LIFT THINE EYES

Mendelssohn/LaBrie (ME) • 62579

The music of *Lift Thine Eyes* comes from Part II of *Elijah*. In the oratorio, it is sung by a trio of angels, sent down to instill hope.

EMBER DANCE





The smoldering remains of a fire flicker back to life. This piece is a musical expression of the glowing ashes and sparks that dance through the night air around a fire. This is accomplished with edgy rhythms and snap pizzicato effects. Exaggerated dynamics and precise articulations add energy and interest, allowing all members of the

orchestra to sparkle!

ENCANTO: FAMILY MADRIGAL

Miranda/Moore (ME) • 39679

This arrangement of the introductory song from Disney's *Encanto* captures the rich syncopations and energy of the traditional Colombian vallenato melody.

ENCANTO: SURFACE PRESSURE Miranda/Moore (ME) • 39668

This reggaeton hit will excite both your students and the audience! In the key of E minor, this excellent cut-time arrangement for string orchestra makes the piece.

ENCANTO: TWO ORUGUITAS Miranda/Longfield (ME) • 39703



This gentle ballad plays a crucial musical role in the movie *Encanto*, ushering in the reconciliation of Mirabel and her Abuela. This arrangement for string orchestra is accessible for young musicians but maintains the Colombian folksong spirit of the original. This piece will touch the heart of anyone that has experienced love and loss.

ENCANTO: WAITING ON A MIRACLE Miranda/Longfield (ME) • 39701

Written in the traditional triple-meter bambuco style of Colombia, this arrangement captures the main character's yearning to be more like the rest of her family while maintaining her unique identity. The infectious melody and rhythm will leave the audience members singing this melody as they leave the performance!

ENEMY (Imagine Dragons, J.I.D.) /Bernotas (ME) • 47883

Enemy has a pulse-pounding rhythm and an intense chorus that will draw you in. This chart-topping song will make your ensemble shine.

ENGLISH COUNTRY REELS AND DANCES Sancho/Woolstenhulme (ME) • 62572



Originally composed by the first published Black British composer for harpsichord, this is an upbeat medley of four dances and reels from his *Twelve Country Dances for the Year 1779*, and is reminiscent of British social dancing during the mid to late 18th century. This arrangement is in G major, with only a few easy shifts for bass.

FANCY LIKE (Walker Hayes) /Roszell (ME) • 47888

This surprise smash was Walker Hayes's first number-one country hit. This chart-topper will be a success with your ensemble and audience!

Lili'uokalani/Balmages (ME) • 71506

This gorgeous fantasy is based on the well-known Hawaiian song Aloha 'Oe, written by Queen Lili'uokalani. Translated as "Farewell to Thee," this piece works extremely well both as a lyrical portion of a program or as a part of a send-off to celebrate graduating students.

FESTIVAL FANFARE

Griesinger (ME) • 58679

Perfect for combined concerts or blended-level ensembles, this piece provides a celebration of music where all students can participate! This piece can be performed alone or with beginning-level parts that use only simple rhythms on open strings or first-finger notes. The G major piece features energetic accompaniment patterns and open-string double stops for a big fanfare of sound.

FIRE SPRITE Spata (ME) • 37980

Some sections have pizzicato work, and the second violins have a couple of short sections of louree' bowing. There is some wide arpeggiated work for the cellos that may require extra attention and, of course, smooth flowing legato phrasing is a must.

GOTHIC QUEST

Golan (ME) • 44560 This aggressive composition for



younger students takes them on a musical journey that is first aggressive, but then moves to a more heartfelt lyrical theme before returning to the bold minor themes for an intense conclusion.

A GRAND AFFAIR Whittington (ME) • 41652

Written in the timeless style of the classical tradition, this piece is rich in melodic content and appealing rhythmic figures. It is well-suited for developing orchestras. Parts are placed in the lower and more comfortable positions, allowing directors to focus on blend, intonation, and rhythmic accuracy. All sections have interesting melodic material to perform as well as integral supportive parts. Moving parts are largely scale-based, placing them well within the capabilities of developing players.

HALLOWEEN THEME Carpenter/Story (ME) • 47880

This timeless theme from the Halloween franchise is one of the creepiest tunes ever written. This accessible arrangement maintains all of the eerie feeling of the original while staying in 4/4. Violin 1 includes optional 3rd position. Optional piano and percussion are included.

THE HARVEST HOME

/Palmer (ME) • 36654

This traditional hompipe is a perfect teaching piece for your young orchestra. All sections get a chance to play the melody, and the students will learn about string crossings, pizzicato, dynamics, and musical phrasing. This fun piece will be a great opener or closer to any concert or festival performance!

HARVEST MOON DANCE Siegler (ME) • 68782

A gentle introduction flows into the familiar poignant melody, using beautiful and unexpected harmonies for a contemporary sound. A solo violin and solo cello restate the melody against a gentle pizzicato accompaniment in this lush orchestration.

HEAVY LIFTING

Bernotas (ME) • 36641

Your cello and string bass sections take center stage in this rockin' piece. This driving, hard-rock selection gives everyone in the orchestra the opportunity to shine while highlighting the low strings. Correlated to Sound Innovations for String Orchestra, Book 2, Level 2.

A HOPE FOR TOMORROW

Sluder (ME) • 40915

Inspire your students to look towards a brighter future. This uplifting piece celebrates the good in our lives and encourages us to remain optimistic in the face of adversity. With opportunities for every instrument to shine, your string orchestra will love exploring the changing finger patterns and lush harmonies of this piece.

HYMN FOR THE DISCOURAGED Lemmel/McInnish (ME) • 49733

Yes, times have been tough lately, and many times we lose hope things will get better. This beautiful hymn arrangement brings you a ray of musical light. From its somber beginning to its peaceful and hopeful ending chord, let this hymn light the way of hope for all mankind!

a moment of quiet reflection during challenging times.

LEGEND OF THE DRAGON CHASERS Thomas (ME) • 71508

A triumphant and resounding march with its fanfare opening, this piece is sure to be a treat for your beginner strings. The players will now use all eight notes in the scale and basic rhythms to bring about amazing harmony and melody.

THE MAGIC FLUTE: Overture

Mozart/Parrish (ME) • 71509

This fantastic arrangement focuses on the overture's fast section, transposed to the more accessible key of C major. All sections get interesting parts without the tricky left-hand work in the original. Extremely approachable with a big, authentic sound, this is an ideal concert or festival addition!

MARCH TRIUMPHANT Lockett (ME) • 58680



This victorious-sounding piece is set in C major with a lot of doubling for a big, majestic sound. The stately theme provides teaching opportunities for low-4 (violins) and low-one or backward extension finger patterns in a straightforward manner with clear and playable harmonies. A robust dance in 3/4, this piece includes optional hand drum and tambourine. With two sections in allegro and presto, this is a great selection for teaching form and independent playing.

This piece will help teachers introduce students to simple cut time and the key of G minor. The rhythmic pulsation is consistent in presentation throughout so the students can focus on more musical matters in this driving composition.

OLD FRENCH SONG

Tschaikowsky/Neidhold (ME) • 57788 Feature a deserving string student with this enchanting arrangement. All solo parts are included for violin, viola, cello, and bass, allowing directors flexibility to spotlight any string instrumentalist in educational ensembles. The lush sounds will elevate student orchestras and celebrate student soloists.

THE OLD RUGGED CROSS Bennard/Longfield (ME) • 40918

Experience the beauty and simplicity of this beloved hymn. This timeless piece has been arranged with carefully crafted parts that allow developing musicians to perform it with ease. It features lush harmonies and a gentle melody that will leave a lasting impression on both the performers and the audience. Perfect for any concert or event where you want to evoke a sense of reverence and contemplation.

A PLACE BY THE SEA Whittington (ME) • 40909

Designed to be played at remembrance events, this work can be taught quickly to elementary or more senior groups alike.

A QUIET PEACE

Meyer (ME) • 36655

Give your students a well-needed break from the chaos and noise of today's world with this gentle, introspective, hymnlike composition. This piece uses suspensions, dissonances, and ninth and seventh chords, which lend a mature sound to the piece. The notes and ranges keep it well within reach. An excellent way for your students to express sensitivity and grace while developing their emotive playing skills.

RAGTIME MARCH Fanning (ME) • 41643

Ragtime and march music, two styles of music that are not common to orchestral playing, are masterfully combined in this bright and energetic selection. In this arrangement, each section of the orchestra has an opportunity to shine. Written in the approachable key of G, the rhythmic patterns and harmonies presented are stylistic of the two genres of music. It is fast moving, culminating with a grand march and subtle hints of the ragtime theme.

RAKES OF MALLOW

/Moore (ME) • 39715

This iconic traditional Irish medley shines in this accessible arrangement. The cut-time version begins in G major and modulates to A major for the final section, providing muchneeded experience with C-sharps and G-sharps!

READY? SET. SOAR!

Hobbs (ME) • 37964

A bold and uplifting work, this piece is bound to be a favorite. The sparkling piano part adds an extra layer of interest and color to the beautiful and soaring string parts.

REFLECTIONS ON A RAINBOW

Bobrowitz (ME) • 37969

Hauntingly elegant, this lush ballad is perfect to use to contrast something faster and more technical. The flowing lines melt together to create a unique and fresh soundscape.

REMEMBRANCE

Fagan (ME) • 44566

You'll hear the emotion in this piece from start to finish. A wonderful opportunity awaits to improve your students' musicianship. It's lush, pensive, and has a multitude of places for students to push and pull the tempo and phrase for great musical effect.

RESOLUTE

Parrish (ME) • 58672

Set in G major, this triumphant theme features a strong, accented melody and energetic accompaniments that frequently utilize double-stops for a resounding effect. The shadows of hardship are heard in a brief shift to E minor before the victorious melody returns with a joy that defies challenges with fearless determination.

RESTLESS SPIRIT

Whittington (ME) • 56649

This uplifting piece features soaring melodies. The first theme is stated in a bright major key, followed by a minor variation. A short linking section then leads to a restatement of the original theme, with an energetic finale closing out the piece. All sections have a chance to perform interesting melodic material, and the cello section is kept particularly busy with some lively and compelling accompaniment parts, which are placed in the lower positions. This will allow the director to focus on intonation, rhythmic accuracy, and general ensemble.

RISE OF THE PHOENIX Lalonde (ME) • 58681



The mythical phoenix symbolizes rebirth and rising out of the ashes. This piece explores a rhythmic motive that gains momentum as it develops then dies away before rising to even greater heights. Set in E minor with D-sharp accidentals the fiery theme uses accented accompaniments and dramatic dynamics to build intensity, growing to a glorious finale.

RISOLUTO Fagan (ME) • 44567

This piece has a serious yet regal demeanor. There is a wonderful contrapuntal section that will give students the opportunity to work on their independent musicianship. This selection is strong, firm, and bold with sophisticated craftsmanship.

RIU, RIU, CHIU

/Rosenhaus (ME) • 37939

Riu, Riu, Chiu is one of the most well-known pieces from the Renaissance and has become a staple of holiday programming. The composition is in Dorian mode, so it could serve as a good introduction to music that isn't in a major key.

Spata (ME) • 36652

Beginners will enjoy the dashing style of this piece while exploring new playing techniques! Familiar notes and rhythms keep the music approachable, and an optional piano part adds additional support. This is a thrilling concert selection that is a great way to show off a variety of new skills.

SHE HAD MEAT HEADS CAROLINA (Cole Swindell) /Kamuf (ME) • 47891

From the top of the country charts, this hit single pays tribute to singer/songwriter Jo Dee Messina and her single Heads Carolina, Tails California. With melodies that get passed throughout the ensemble, this piece will engage both your students and audience.

SHUDDER TO THINK Spata (ME) • 44568

The bows will be shuddering in this piece as the students dig into aggressive sixteenth rhythms.

16TH SUITE





This set of four contrasting folk tunes introduces common 16th-note patterns to beginning students. This concert etude allows students to practice each pattern in different contexts: melodies, accompaniments, and in a variety of simple meters and keys. Whether performed as a suite or individual movements, this piece will enhance any

concert program while developing essential skills.

SMOKY MOUNTAIN LULLABY Donahoe (ME) • 68784

This piece, influenced by the music of Appalachia, feels like a love ballad, but evokes a love of home and country, perhaps more so than the love of another person. Envision a beautiful evening, quietly watching the sun go down over the mountains from the front porch. This piece is a great opportunity to work on developing a beautiful tone and depth of sound.

SOLSTICE CANYON O'Loughlin (ME) • 66731

Be transported to the wide-open spaces of a beautiful vista overlooking a canyon. This piece brings a strong motivic approach throughout, with a gentle waltz feel giving us a strong piece for younger students.

SPIDER-MAN: NO WAY HOME, MAIN THEME Giacchino/Longfield (ME) • 39655

This arrangement captures the energy of the original without overwhelming your students. Beginning in 3/4 time but changing to 4/4 near the end, this D minor arrangement provides a good opportunity to work on this fundamental meter change.

STARCHASERS Otto (ME) • 52620

A sequel to Sunchasers #52561, this dark, driving piece makes B minor accessible to younger players by carefully avoiding any extensions in the violin, viola, and cello parts. Its memorable themes, reminiscent of a nighttime adventure, are spread across all instruments. The middle section becomes ethereal with the pizzicato in the viola, evoking an image of twinkling stars. A great teaching piece for 3/4 time and using low-2 and high-2 work to reinforce the 1-2 finger pattern.

TAKATIKI

LaBrie (ME) • 66738

Reinforce simple sixteenth-note rhythms with this infectious Latin style piece. The title is a play on the Kodály counting system. With teaching materials included to help your students, this piece is just plain fun!

A TAYLOR SWIFT DUO

/Story (ME) • 47882

This fantastic arrangement is a medley of two of Taylor Swift's biggest hits---Bad Blood and You Belong With Me.

THE TALE IS TOLD

Terry (ME) • 37992

This original work ties several sections in slightly different tempos together with a buoyant and energetic melody. There are excellent dynamic shadings presented throughout as the melody is transferred from section to section.

THREE PIECE WITH A SIDE OF ROSIN Parton (ME) • 67598

This short selection is much like a waltz set in 3/4 time. All sections of the orchestra are featured on the melody, and students alternate between arco and pizzicato.

TO THE MOON AND BACK Kamuf (ME) • 52624

Beautiful melodies and rich harmonies make this an excellent lyrical work for your orchestra. All sections will shine as melodic material is passed through the ensemble in this highly expressive piece.

TOMORROW (Annie)

/Kamuf (ME) • 47885 Bring one of the all-time greatest Broadway melodies to your students and audience! Drumset and percussion add drive

and color to this arrangement.

TOO BIG SHOES Sharp, S. (ME) • 57791

This fun 8-bar blues form in G mixolydian is played with swung eighth notes. The chromatics presented in the work are primarily alternating between 2 and low 2 fingerings. All sections but the double bass stay in first position, with the singular exception of a two-bar cello line. The phrase "too big shoes" can be found in several musical motifs throughout the piece. In fact, in the "ride out" section, the musicians are encouraged to sing or shout "too big shoes" as they play.

TOUR OF IRELAND

/Neidhold (ME) • 57789

Take a musical tour of the Emerald Isle. Three popular Irish tunes come to life with melody in all parts. From silky-slow to fiery-fast, it begins with the stately and poignant, The Wren. Next, the tempo jumps for a buoyant Kerry Polka, followed by a racing The Wind That Shakes the Barley, with a final tempo push to a flying ending.

TROUBLED WATERS Sluder (ME) • 40924



BEGINNING STRING SERIES Set sail on a stormy adventure with this exciting and challenging piece. With a tonality that is exclusively in D minor, the ensemble gets to experience the ups and downs of navigating rough seas through the sounds of the waves rising and crashing in the melodies. This piece is perfect for string orchestras seeking to enhance their technique with the use

of the lowered 2nd finger for upper strings, and cellos and basses will be challenged with a new accented motif.

A UTOPIAN FANTASIA Granata (M) • 52616



This piece depicts a beautifully majestic and serene landscape shrouded in mystery and wonder. Set in the key of E minor, the opening features a rich legato ballad with an eerily somber melody passing through each section. The mood abruptly shifts to a jarring and heavily accented six-note motif. A small contrapuntal passage develops this

motif, interspersed with the original opening melody. Inversions of the theme finally give way to a call-and-response dialogue within the different sections before ending quietly and slowly with a subtle hint to the opening.

LA VALENTINA

/Vargas (ME) • 68783

This Mexican folk song is played by many mariachi groups in Mexico and across the United States. La Valentina was written as a tribute to Valentina Ramirez Avitia, who fought in the Mexican Revolution at a time when women were not allowed in the Mexican military.

VALKYRIE

Ramsey-White (ME) • 58673



In Old Norse, Valkyrja were noble maidens that brought perished heroes to the afterlife (Valhalla) where they would prepare for Ragnarok. In the beginning of this dramatic piece, the upper and lower strings duel for dominance, setting the scene of an epic battle. The middle section depicts the Valkyries, represented by a lyrical cello

melody, descending from the heavens to take their chosen to Valhalla.

LOS VAQUEROS (The Cowboys) Spata (ME) • 44572

This tuneful piece is reminiscent of western movie soundtracks. It is a jaunty tune which students and audiences will love. Every section of the orchestra gets a chance to shine with melodic material.

WARRIOR OF THE RIVER Morales (ME) • 41647

A frontier settlement at the edge of the kingdom is under attack! Granted magical abilities for being pure of heart, our hero hamesses the power of the river surrounding the village to fight back the intruders. With the retreat of a demoralized enemy complete, a legend is born. This piece features powerful unified rhythms as well as call-and-response sections. It was designed to include the use of C natural on the A string for all parts. First position is maintained for the entire orchestra with one exception in the bass part. The use of slurs, accents, and a wide dynamic range provides for a variety of bow development opportunities.

THE WAYFARER

Oostenbroek (ME) • 71510

Introduce your orchestra to D minor with no extension fingerings needed! Instead of focusing on fingerings for B-flat, students can enjoy the experience of playing in a minor tonality. A simple, folk-like melody takes the listener on a beautiful journey through the countryside. A brief interlude in D major creates contrast and allows the low strings to shine.

WELLERMAN

/Longfield (ME) • 39659

This arrangement of the rousing traditional sea chanty from New Zealand is in B minor and gives all the sections a chance at the melody, as well as providing interesting textural changes. For added energy, get the audience to stomp along!

Medium Easy (cont.)

WHOLE BOW WALTZ Koller (ME) • 57785

A fun way to teach orchestra students some much-needed bow management skills. In this G major piece, the waltz melody includes plenty of long notes so students learn to control bow speed and pressure. Playing at the frog is encouraged in many measures so students can be in the right part of their bows when whole bows are needed. All sections get a turn to play the melody. The happy waltz melody becomes somewhat menacing and mysterious as B-flats are introduced in one variation. For a fun challenge near the end, the students learn to play progressively longer notes together.

WINTER AIRE

/Denney (ME) • 71504

This arrangement of the traditional Scottish song Gloomy Winter's Noo Awa' is a perfect change of pace for a winter program. The beautiful melodic lines develop slowly and intertwine seamlessly, bringing expressive energy to your ensemble. These highly accessible parts in first position allow students to work on smooth bow strokes, legato melodic lines, and dotted guarter-eighth note rhythms in E minor.

WISTERIA WALTZ

Nishimura (ME) • 58668

Gentle melodies and unique harmonies are featured in this waltz-style piece to create a tranquil and mysterious mood. The simple rhythms are limited to mainly half notes and quarter notes, but the beautiful theme and rich countermelodies give the ensemble a mature sound.

WIZARD'S QUEST

Siegler (ME) • 67599

A dark and driving work, the energetic E minor melody depicts the adventure of a quest in Medieval times-imagine the nonstop action of a wizard determined to win against all odds. An optional drum part adds to the medieval sound and could portray the wizard's magic wand.

ZIG ZAG

O'Loughlin (ME) • 66737

This exciting composition for the young string orchestra is full of flare, your students will want to play the rhythmic motifs again and again!

Medium

ADAGIETTO FOR STRING ORCHESTRA Kantorski (M) • 67601

This relatively slow piece is melodically and rhythmically simple, also marked dolcissimo. Performers in every section of the ensemble can focus on producing a beautiful, rich, warm string tone regardless of the dynamic level.

ADORATION

Price/Olson (M) • 40910



Originally composed for organ by Black, female composer Florence Price, this piece, with its slow, expressive melodies, is a great opportunity for younger orchestras to work on bow distribution and vibrato. All parts, except for a small section for the basses, are playable in first position, making it an excellent transition piece for shifting

exercises. This arrangement captures the beauty and richness of the original composition.

AFRICAN SUITE: DANSE

Coleridge-Taylor/Moss (M) • 52617



Originally, the final movement from African Suite, this light-hearted dance begins with two introductory chords followed by energetic swinging rhythms and repeated angular melodies. Students will love the moods in this festive overture, evocative of Broadway musicals from a later era.

ALL IS BRIGHT

/Parsons (M) • 66741

This sweeping holiday piece using Hark! The Herald Angels Sing and ever popular Silent Night is joyful, harmonical, and fresh in its presentation of these classic carols. Something new and different for your next holiday concert.

ΑΜΑΡΟΙ Α

Garcia, J./Longfield (M) • 41644



A Spanish love song, the title translates as the flower "poppy." Recorded by numerous artists, from operatic tenors to popular crooners, in 1941 it reached #1 on the Billboard charts. It was also featured in a number of movie soundtracks. Its lyrics have been translated into multiple languages.

AMERICAN PATROL





Originally a piano piece by composer F.W. Meacham written in 1885. this piece depicts the approaching, passing, and fading away into the distance of a military unit. This skillfully created toetapping rendition will impress your audiences

ANCIENT AIRS AND DANCES, SUITE 1: Balletto Respighi/Woolstenhulme (M) • 62573

Colorful and graceful, this accessible arrangement begins in G major, transitions to G minor, then back to G major. Although Respighi composed the movement from his first suite in 1917, it retains the natural beauty of the Renaissance period.

ANTI-HERO (Taylor Swift) /Moore (M) • 39776

Your students will love playing one of the best songs of 2022. This excellent arrangement artfully captures the catchy rhythms and energetic drive of the song that broke the world record for opening-day streaming!

ARMONICO (fr. Four Violin Concerto in b, Op. 3 No. 10) Vivaldi/Parrish (M) • 71514

This faithful arrangement comes from Vivaldi's first set of published concertos. Capturing the spirit of the original, this setting of the first movement displays the power and focus that helped the piece stand out from other works of the era.

BALLAD AND JIG Hart (M) • 68787



This piece opens with singingly expressive melodies in G major, allowing the orchestra to focus on playing in a connected ballad style. The lively jig section of the piece features energetic and memorable melodies in E dorian and A mixolydian. Give your top players the spotlight with the included violin and cello solos!

BASILE'S GALOP, OP, 9 Bares/Bishop (M) • 62574



American composer Basile Bares began life as a slave child in New Orleans, LA. He lived and worked for a piano shop owner who gave him opportunities to study music and tune pianos. He became a popular pianist and composer and this little Galop is one novelty from his pen. This arrangement gives students the chance

to have fun with fantastic parts for all!

BATTLE

Newbold (M) • 71515

Inspired by ancient Northern European and Scandinavian fiddle music, this piece paints a picture of war long ago while reflecting on the frustration and challenges of the current world. It uses a wealth of exciting string effects, including col legno, fingerboard slaps, snap pizzicato, and more.

BATTLE CRY

Donahoe (M) • 68788

This piece is meant to embody the warrior spirit! With heavy articulations and driving rhythms, students should play with strong accents and attention to articulation markings. Includes a brief moment of reflection, where students can use a more legato bow stroke and vibrato.

BIG SKY OVERTURE

Atteberry (M) • 68789

Sweeping melodies punctuated by energetic rhythmic motives make this original overture perfect for concert and contest. Observing traditional overture form, the main theme is set first as a chorale, then as a spirited allegro. Emerging musicians utilize pizzicato, shifting for violin 1 and polyphonic textures over long crescendos to easily create a sound that is mature and sophisticated.

BLACK ADAM, MAIN THEME

/Bernotas (M) • 47884

The powerful theme from the action-packed DC Superhero adventure Black Adam comes to life in this fantastic arrangement. The epic theme is dark and bold, and all sections of the orchestra have engaging and exciting parts.

BULLSEYE

Eveland (M) • 40929

Get ready to hit the target with this exciting composition. From the opening notes played by the upper strings, this piece keeps you on your toes with a catchy melody passed around the orchestra. You'll love the call and response between the upper and lower strings, and the sudden tempo change adds even more excitement. With careful attention to accents and technique, this piece will hit its mark.

CAPRIOL DANCES

Warlock/Neidhold (M) • 58683

Two of the most famous movements from the enigmatic Capriol Suite, Basse-Danse and Mattachins (Sword Dance), are adapted here for intermediate orchestra, allowing younger students to experience the high-energy melodies and unique harmonies of these popular dances.

CARNIVAL OF THE AMPHIBIANS Barnard (M) • 40930

Get ready to hop, slither, and crawl with this piece inspired by the well-known work of Saint-Saëns. This spin on the classic Carnival of the Animals, featuring amphibians in movements Frogs and Toads, Caecilians, and Newts and Salamanders. Easily memorized parts allow your string players to process down the aisles as they introduce each part of this beautiful round, followed by leading the audience in the singing of Silent Night.

CHRISTMAS WITH THE NUTCRACKER Tschaikowsky/LaBrie (M) • 43640



A medley of themes from The Nutcracker along with familiar carols weaving in and out. This is your one stop shop for all things Christmas ... beautifully tied up with a bow in about 3 1/2 minutes. A really fun addition to Christmas repertoire!

COLORADO RIVER ADVENTURE Spata (M) • 43634

Come and take an exhilarating ride down the Colorado River. The music captures the essence of the river racing through whitewater rapids and flowing through tranquil canyons.

CONCERTO GROSSO, OP. 6, NO. 8 (Christmas **Concerto): Pastorale**

Corelli/Bangle (M) • 37790

This famous movement is brought to new life in an accessible new arrangement.

DANSE ESTRANGE

Mosier (M) • 43635

Unique sounds abound in this fascinating new composition. Your viola, cello, and bass performers will love the rich and singing melodies of their parts that contrast beautifully with the percussive and syncopated patterns of later sections.

DOGPATCH TRAILS: Caravan Spring & Campfire Shindig

Woodruff (M) • 62575

This 2-mvt. suite pays homage to the Dogpatch (Arkansas) area. Mvt. 1 captures the enthusiasm of wagon train travelers ready to embark on a new life out west. The 2nd myt. portravs hikers, campers, and fishers as they gather around the campfire sharing tall tales about their encounters on the trail.

EASY ON ME (Adele) /Moore (M) • 39662

This masterful arrangement is in an easy key and range for string players, and rich in syncopations, keeping with Adele's inimitable style. This will be a big hit!

ELGAR'S ANDANTE AND MARCH Elgar/Krinke (M) • 68781

This arrangement is from a set of violin and piano pieces.

ENCANTO: WE DON'T TALK ABOUT BRUNO Miranda/Longfield (M) • 39661

This infectious mix of salsa and guajira with pop, hip-hop, dance, and Broadway elements rose to the top of the charts all around the world! This arrangement is true to the original, while still making it approachable for younger musicians. Your audience (and students) will definitely be singing along!

THE ENTERTAINER Joplin/Olson (M) • 40926

Get your audience's toes tapping with



The Entertainer this arrangement of Joplin's famous ragtime tune. It is perfect for introducing your orchestra to syncopated rhythms and exploring easy double-stops. Originally composed for piano in 1902, this piece gained international popularity as the theme music for the 1973 Oscarwinning film, The Sting and is now

associated with the ice cream truck.

AN EPIC JOURNEY Barnard (M) • 40927

This piece takes students on a musical adventure full of mystery, danger, and triumph. As students encounter many orchestral bowings and musical motives, they'll reinforce solid technique and orchestral skills. The piece travels through several exciting musical episodes in E minor before arriving at its relative, G major. With the exception of a soaring, but simple octave divisi passage in the first violins, the work is voiced entirely in the lower position for all string sections. This engaging piece offers a fun challenge for intermediate string orchestras

EXPEDITION

Olson (M) • 40917

The opening theme of this exciting and mysterious piece allows for expressive playing from the cellos before the entire orchestra embarks on a musical journey filled with a variety of styles and bow strokes. Shifting is required for first violins and cellos, but the other parts may be played in first position.

FALCON RIDGE

Isaac (M) • 58684



This exciting piece will help orchestra students soar to new heights! The brisk tempo and light staccato accompaniment offer the opportunity to practice a brushed bow stroke, and first violin and bass sections will encounter some easy shifting. Accented syncopation with ties across the bar are performed in all sections, perfect for

refining subdividing skills.

FALCONWING

Williams, C. (M) • 44559

Take a ride on a falcon's wing with this rhythmic, yet soaring, piece. This delightful composition takes us on a musical journey with lots of contrasts. It will be a ride worth taking for your students and audiences alike.

FANTASIA FROM DOWN UNDER

/Barnard (M) • 40928



Take a musical journey to the land down under with this medley of Australian folk songs, including Wyndham Drovers, Wallaby Stew, Bound for South Australia, and Waltzing Matilda. It will have your audience tapping their toes and swaying to the rhythm, with its quick-moving form and featured lyrical sections. This piece showcases all

sections through a variety of meters and key signatures, as students are challenged to perform an assortment of orchestral bowings

FLOWERS (Miley Cyrus)

/Roszell (M) • 47892

Perfect for your spring concert, this massive number-one hit comes to your string orchestra.

FRFF RUN

Ramsey-White (M) • 43637

Filled with life and vitality, this piece is contemporary and fresh. The bold, colorful harmony is blended perfectly with interweaving melodic lines.

FREEDOM (Jon Batiste)

/Murtha (M) • 39722

This Grammy-award winning anthem to freedom comes to life in this sparkling G major arrangement. With all the verve and spirit of the original, you'll soon have students doing the famous dances moves as part of the performance!

GATES OF OLYMPUS

Donahoe (M) • 37998

A courtly and stately piece worthy of a regal procession. Musically rich and rewarding, there is something for everyone in this new composition.

THE GUARDIAN HERO

Hinkel (M) • 67603

This is a driving, groovy work for string orchestra and optional drum set. A half-time lyrical section provides the chance for everyone to take a breath before returning to the excitement of the beginning.

HARY JANOS SUITE: Intermezzo

Kodaly/Wagner (M) • 52614

Written in the style of a spirited Czardas, a traditional Hungarian folk dance. Full of life and endless energy, the music instantly grabs the audience's attention, cheering the spirit with driving rhythms and dynamic themes. An impressive addition to any concert, the work is a worthy upper-level showpiece for spring contests

HERR MANNELIG

/Newbold (M) • 71511



A driving, steady tempo combines with optional percussion in this unique and powerful setting of a Swedish folk song about a mountain troll that attempts to win over a human man. Also known as The Mountain Troll's Proposal, this arrangement includes optional solos. so you can either feature a talented student or perform with the entire orchestra.

THE HIGHLAND GAMES

Dudinsky (M) • 49808

This heroic and daring piece that draws inspiration from the annual Highland Games in Scotland. A Gaelic tune is passed through different sections of the orchestra and is followed by a building secondary theme. This brings the piece to new heights in a flowing legato section, depicting the breeze blowing through the lush grass of the Scottish Highlands. The primary theme makes its appearance again in different variations for an epic closing to this gallant piece. This work will help players practice ostinato and play quick melodic patterns.

/Kazik (M) • 39745 This arrangement captures all the



wonder (and waggish humor) of the hit 1990 movie. Retaining many of the guirky rhythms and chromaticism of the original, this arrangement will provide opportunities for your students to grow and develop in the context of this fun and accessible medley.

HYDRANGEA

Nishimura (M) • 66743

The sweeping melodies along with an absolutely gorgeous harmonic palette leave a lasting impression on all who play this elegant new work.

INDES GALANTES, LES: Les Sauvages Rameau/Monday (M) • 62578

From one of Rameau's opera-ballets, this is a dance composed in rondo form in G minor. A true gem! A few moments of shifting for first violins and basses.

INTERMEZZO (fr. Cavalleria Rusticana)

Mascagni/LaBrie (M) • 71525

Expressive playing is explored with music well within reach of younger ensembles, while also an excellent option for more mature groups. An optional harp part adds depth and detail.

ISLE OF DESTINY

Barlowe (M) • 58685

This piece will lead your students to the edge of their musical imagination. From the proud Celtic heartbeat of the bodhran (Celtic drum), to the heartfelt and noble middle section, this uplifting 6/8 piece is an enchanting journey for all.

ISOLATION BLUES

Day (M) • 37854

Written during a long stay at home, this introspective work for string orchestras is charming and boasts a catchy melody too! Students will enjoy the intrigue in all the "blue" notes.

JALAPEÑO TANGO Williams, C. (M) • 44561



This piece contains all of the dramatic flavor of the native Brazilian tango. There is the push and pull of the tempo, dynamics, and rhythmic variety that bring about the intrigue of the tango. The piece is perfect to introduce this vital musical form.

JET STREAM

Whittington (M) • 62577 Based on a 3-note rhythmic motif, this piece is a jazzy, high energy, original work with strong melodies and infectious rhythmic components. Shifting is not required.

KINGSGATE CASTLE

Story (M) • 52612

Named for the majestic 18th-century structure on the southeast coast of England, this piece is set in a traditional ABA overture form.

LABYRINTH

Williams, C. (M) • 58686 Follow the twists and turns of this eerie



dance through a dark maze of shadows. In this danse macabre style waltz, phantoms and whispers haunt every turn as the E minor melody steps down a creepy chromatic staircase. Students will experience unexpected accidentals, sneaky pizzicato, and a variety of bowing patterns that alternate from tip-

toe staccato to slurred phrases that accelerate as it descends into madness!

LET THE BELLS RING! /Buckley (M) • 39735

This up-tempo arrangement of the traditional Ukrainian Bell Carol adds new excitement to an audience favorite! In E minor, both the key and the range work well for young string players. This sparkling rendition brings satisfying challenges to young musicians, and will impress your audience!

LOTUS Nishimura (M) • 36653



The lotus flower is known as a symbol of the sun because it closes at night and reopens at dawn. This stunning piece is full of dramatic harmonies and flowing melodies. Each part offers the opportunity for heartfelt and expressive performance. When the flower blooms, it makes a faint popping sound, though it's rare to hear unaided. The composer

uses pizzicato in the lower instruments at the beginning of the piece to invoke the sound of the bloom.

LUNA'S DIVERSION Sciaino (M) • 49714

This selection is inspired by the moon over the Italian coast and offers a unique flavor to any concert program. Performers and audiences alike will be swept away on a European holiday as they chase La Luna and all of her charm through moonlit streets. This selection aims to capture the artistic and guirky flair of the setting, with La Luna acting as the central character.

MADE YOU LOOK (Meghan Trainor) /Bernotas (M) • 47887

This terrific song is full of energy and spirit! The infectious melody will have your audience dancing in the aisles.

MEKANNO

Whittington (M) • 41653

This appealing and energetic composition projects a contemporary vibe that is based on an infectious 8-bar motif. As they build towards the final climax, players will feel as though they are part of a big machine; lurching and chugging toward some wonderfully mysterious destination. Though the momentum is rhythmically driven, the piece is also bursting with melody. It has been written to ensure that all sections have interesting parts to play. All instruments have been awarded interesting melodic sections, as well as countermelodies and fun bits of rhythmic and melodic interplay. Range for all instruments is in the lower positions in order to allow directors to place their focus on intonation and rhythmic accuracy.

Dudinsky (M) • 49799

This dramatic and intriguing piece draws inspiration from the traditional Baltic folk dance, the tropak. A familiar melody is repeated throughout the piece, gradually becoming faster and more intricate. It then develops into a beautiful legato section that builds tension before breaking into a furious dance. This piece helps players master the technique of playing grace notes as well as gradually increasing tempo as an ensemble.

MONTAGUE MINUETTE

Sancho/Morales (M) • 41645

This piece explores the classical style of playing, including bowings, dynamic changes, and phrasing. The consistent 3/4 time signature allows students to perform with a lyrical musical style while maintaining forward movement. The piece uses both D major and A major and requires all sections to use extensions. This refined piece is a great introduction to a lesser-known Classical era composer and is a beautiful addition to your concert repertoire.

MOTO PERPETUO

Bobrowitz (M) • 37699

Delicate bowing considerations will help strengthen legato bowing on the off-beats. Each section has meaningful material. A great teaching piece that will sound great in a performance too!

THE MOUNTAIN CITY FIDDLERS Hart (M) • 68790

Titled after the Fiddlers Convention of 1925, held in Mountain City, Tennessee, this piece opens with violin and cello solos in A major, with stomping feet and clapping hands adding to the mood! All sections of the orchestra share in the fun as the numerous melodies are passed around. This piece is a great way to reinforce work on double stops!

MYTH OF THE GOLDEN CAMEL

Sanguinito (M) • 67604

Take your students on an exciting musical journey across the vast Arabian desert landscape between ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia. Foreboding motifs in the lower strings combine with frenetic musical passages reminiscent of a ritual dance that will be sure to keep your students and audiences captivated!

Fresh and varied scoring techniques create a seamless work perfectly suited as a program or set opener that rings out with unbridled joy from beginning to end.

RECUERDOS DE LA ALHAMBRA Tarrega/Tassone (M) • 41650

Recuerdos de la Alhambra (Memories of the Alhambra) is an arrangement of the famous and popular classical guitar piece. The piece evokes the grandeur and mystigue of the famous palace and fortress located in Granada, Spain. It also highlights the Arabic influence on the music of Spain.

REEL MUSIC /Tassone (M) • 41651



Three old Irish jigs are the material for each of the movements. Swallowtail Jig, also known as The Dancing Master, may possibly refer to the type of coat with tails typically worn by early 19th century dancing masters. Cooley's Reel, is a traditional Irish tune associated with the accordion player Joe Cooley. Played in a slow tempo it

serves as a contrast between the faster first movement and third movement. The Devil's Dream.

RENAISSANCE DANCES Eveland (M) • 43638

These contrasting "dance" sections open with a bright and spirited 2/4 while the next section is smooth and flowing in 3/4. It is tied together nicely with a recap of the original theme.

RFPARTIF

Atwell (M) • 62586 A call and response-type work, this is a fun one where each

voice has the melody at various times. It's all about having a fun conversation within the orchestra and with rhythmic vitality and harmonic variety!

RIVER RUN

Sharp, T. (M) • 57793

A quick-paced piece in E minor in an ABABA form, featuring syncopated rhythms, flowing melodies, varied textures, and a chance for each section to play the melody. The texture thins out as the pace slows to the final cadence.

ROMANZA

Donizetti/Tassone (M) • 68792

This is an arrangement of the beautiful romanza, Una furtiva lagrima (A furtive tear), from the Italian opera L'elisir d'amore by Donizetti. It is sung by Nemorino when it appears that the love potion he bought to win the heart of his dream lady, Adina, is working. This arrangement captures the poignancy and heartfelt expressivity of Donizetti's gorgeous melody.

RONDO RECIPE

Kaisershot (M) • 68793

A light-hearted work to be approached in the classical style, the "dash of Mozart" is not a facetious quote, for there is in fact a small quote of music by Mozart hidden within the whole of this piece. It lasts only for a brief moment, hence the "dash." As with many pieces of chamber music from this era, the style is light and buoyant and should never become heavy handed. The tempo should remain brisk throughout, and attention to melodic lines should be the focus with accompanying lines providing the necessary harmonic as well as rhythmic support.

Oostenbroek (M) • 71517

Feel the rush of adrenaline in this exciting work! A spirited melody combines with a highly rhythmic background to create a sense of energy and momentum throughout each section. Included are many opportunities to explore more advanced techniques and musicality.

SCENES FROM CHILDHOOD: Reverie Schumann/Fin (M) • 48616

Schumann's Scenes from Childhood is a set of thirteen pieces for piano, the seventh one, Reverie or "Traeumerei," means dreaming. Plaving soft, slow pieces is never easy, and requires great bow control, focusing on weight and speed. This arrangement is also guite rhythmically challenging, using long slurs and ties, which require planning and careful counting for entrances. Rubato is used throughout the piece, and tempo changes call for the students to pay close attention to the director. There are opportunities for all to practice vibrato, and some position work in the violin and viola parts.

SHAKER VARIATIONS /Palmer (M) • 36647

This arrangement is a theme and variations on the familiar Shaker melody, Simple Gifts. Each section has the opportunity to play musical lines in a variety of styles. Rich harmonies will create a mature orchestral sound, and a strong ending makes this piece a great opener or closer for any concert or festival performance.

SHIMMERING DAYDREAMS

Clark (M) • 66744



What is a shimmering daydream? You will know once you hear this lush and lyrical work. This piece has contemplative thoughts with a bit of longing and a sense of melancholy but hopeful at the same time. Young musicians will be stretched to express themselves musically with this sensational work

SHORT ORDER COOKS Bobrowitz (M) • 57783

This music captures the constant energy of being a short order cook. There are many great teaching concepts in this piece: sudden dynamic changes, accents, crescendos, and afterbeat rhythms, to mention a few.

SIX STRING QUARTETS OP. 1: Rondeau No. 3 Bologne/Debbaut (M) • 58675



This lively rondeau is a classic sevenpart rondo in G major, D major, and G minor. As was typical of the classical style, the melody is heard mainly in first violin, while other sections provide supporting harmonic and rhythmic roles. The essence of the string quartet scoring is retained by having the bass double the cello part, resulting in a

charming and accessible concert selection.

SOMEDAY

Holbrook, P. (M) • 44569



The piece is profound in its expressive nature, and will ignite the musical passion in your students. There are so many opportunities in this piece to be expressive and it will be a rare musical treat for your audiences.

SONATA A 7

Schmelzer/Olson (M) • 40916



This piece brings the Renaissance era to life with lush harmonies and a contrapuntal texture that provide a lively and fun performance for all parts of the orchestra. The middle section presents a challenging fugue and the viola and cello sections are divided into two parts, just like the violins.

SONATA IN G MINOR, K. 315

Scarlatti/Nishimura (M) • 58682

Originally a simple and elegant keyboard work, this arrangement features a short two-measure motif, characteristic of the Baroque period. The theme is worked into every section in a variety of ranges as it develops. A wonderful introduction to baroque style performance featuring articulations and charming melodic counterpoint.

SOULPRINTS

Dietz (M) • 67602

This piece is a dynamic three-movement work that explores concepts of the human soul and spirituality.

SPIDER-MAN: NO WAY HOME, THEMES FROM Giacchino/Moore (M) • 39709

This arrangement of several themes captures both the drive and the pathos from the movie. It requires some higher position work and rhythmic reading from all players, but they will find the challenge worthwhile!

A tango is always an audience favorite! Students enjoy learning this style with its characteristic syncopation, dynamic contrasts and fun chromatic moments. This original will definitely cast a bit of warm 'sunshine' during your next concert!

TANGO TRAICIONERO Mosier (M) • 36649

Tango Traicionero means "treacherous tango." Imagine a gathering of Bohemian nomads and workers having a dance party in the streets. There is a natural tension in this tango which mirrors the intoxicating nighttime atmosphere. All sections work together to perform slides and shifts between notes of the melodic figure to add intrigue to the sound. A lively middle section builds to a key change and recapitulation. The work culminates with tense chords for an exciting finish.

A TENDER MOMENT IN TIME Gordon, A. (M) • 36645

This piece wonderfully captures the sincerity of human emotions in life's most delicate moments. An expressive melody set in the key of C floats on colorful harmonies designed to make a developing orchestra sound full.

TICO TICO

Abreu/Kazik (M) • 39772

This new arrangement of the Brazilian classic for orchestra (with optional piano and percussion) captures all the fun and energy of the original in a format that will be easily performable by your students. The audience will be dancing in the aisles!

LA TRAVIATA: Prelude to Act I Verdi/Whittington (M) • 56651

Arranged so that all sections have interesting and engaging material to perform, it is written in the lower positions so directors can focus on intonation, blend, and rhythmic accuracy. A whimsical piece that helps players smoothly navigate between pizzicato and arco techniques. The piece follows a rondo pattern that carries different themes. It draws inspiration from a vision of droplets creating rippled images in the water, reflecting light and colors that swirl together with the rising mist.

WATER MUSIC SUITE 2: Hornpipe and Bourree Handel/Monday (M) • 71513

This joyful arrangement pairs Handel's *Hompipe* and *Bourrée* in the form of a minuet and trio. In the original key of F major, all parts are engaging while staying remarkably true to Handel's original intent.

Though initially written over 50 years ago, Gaye's plea for peace and understanding is a message that resonates today. This arrangement maintains the original's easy, cool, and R&B rhythms in a format that allows modern-day students to "find a way to bring some loving here today."

A WICKED VOW

Spata (M) • 37994

All the musicians in your ensemble will enjoy a good workout with this energetic and aggressive work. There is an effective (but optional) harp part included.

THE WINTER KING

Spata (M) • 58688

Bold, brisk melodies describe thrilling adventures in this exciting concert overture in D minor! Students will enjoy the vivid and expressive style, but the real focus is on triple-meter rhythms and hooked bowings as players experience a variety of common 6/8 rhythms.

A WINTER POEM

Eveland (M) • 43639

A subtle and evocative opening section sets up a faster and livelier section built upon themes presented in the first section. The interesting counterpoint will keep all the players (as well as the audience) engaged. A great combination of somber and joyful moods are presented in the two contrasting sections.

for all sections. Your top players in first violin and cello will shine in the solo parts, which are not overly extensive. With its variety of keys and solo opportunities for all sections, this piece will be an excellent addition to your advanced orchestra's repertoire.

LA BELLA CUBANA

Lafitte/Debbaut (MD) • 58689

In addition to numerous etudes and a virtuosic violin concerto, violinist Joseph (José) White Lafitte composed this habanera for two violins. In this arrangement, the lyrical melodic solos are spread throughout the orchestra, and traditional Cuban dance rhythms in the middle theme capture the vibrant joy of the original work.

CAPRICCIO FOR VIOLIN & STRING ORCHESTRA Parks (MD) • 67607

This lively work for violin and string accompaniment offers the soloist an opportunity to be technically challenged as well as melodically expressive. The listener will enjoy the "Tresillo," a dance rhythm that will enhance the energetic excitement being displayed!

CZECH SUITE: Polka Dvorak/Bailey (MD) • 62585

One of the most celebrated of traditional Czech dances, this movement is a delight on any concert program. It requires minimal shifting for first violins and stays in D minor/D major.

"F-A-E" SONATA FOR VIOLIN AND PIANO: Scherzo Brahms/Monday (MD) • 43636

All the thrilling highs and despondent lows are represented in this new arrangement. "F-A-E" refers to the German frei aber einsam which translates to "free but lonely" or "free but alone."

SYMPHONY NO. 1: Presto, Mvt. I Haydn/Barnard (MD) • 40925

While keeping true to the original score, this arrangement provides string orchestras the opportunity to perform Haydn's first symphony. With an exciting Mannheim crescendo at the beginning of the exposition, this piece offers many teaching opportunities throughout. Carefully edited for musical style and playability, this is a fun and challenging work that's often unknown to audiences and adjudicators alike. Perfect as a program and festival opener, this work is sure to impress.

SYMPHONY NO. 2 (Finale) Mayer/Taylor (MD) • 58692

A rare transcription of the music of composer Emilie Mayer! This stormy final movement from her second symphony reveals a bold and confident style. This arrangement for string orchestra and timpani was drawn from the handwritten score, offering a profound opportunity to experience the music of this incredible composer for the first time.

TECTONIC SHIFT

Gelfer (MD) • 58691

This spirited work depicts Earth's plate tectonics shifting with a dynamic explosion of sound and rhythm. Set in 7/8 time, the contemporary motif will challenge each section while all players have shifting opportunities. Basses are featured with a soli section that drives the momentum of this energizing piece.

THRILLER (Michael Jackson) /Newbold (MD) • 71523

Don't miss out on this perfect showstopper! There are numerous performing options, either with strings alone or with the optional drum set, electric bass, and synth parts.

TORRENT

Allen (MD) • 68796

A storm of fiddle tunes and ostinatos portray a flash flood rushing down a southwestern slot canyon in this fast-paced outing. This piece is set in a lively 6/8 meter in minor pentatonic tonality. After the piece flows through a few fiddle-friendly keys, the first violins bring on the deluge with accessible third position arpeggios.

WHISPERS OF COLOR Reznicow (MD) • 41649



The composition features a beautiful and enchanting orchestration that utilizes flowing lines, short solo passages, and a variety of string effects such as pizzicatos, flautando bowing, and trills throughout the score. The formal structure of the piece is in ABA, using a soft entrance, a more intense middle section, and a return of the

opening theme, while concluding in a peaceful manner.

WINDS OF ARABIA

Susi (MD) • 68795 This piece will evoke images of the exotic Arabian desert. The mode, meter and pizzicato passages help provide the Middle Eastern sound that drives this camel caravan through the desert. The syncopation, dynamic contrast and tremolos generate the energy for this invigorating work.

ZIA RESILIENCE Neidhold (MD) • 40931

This thrilling and cinematic piece will captivate both performers and audiences. Featuring soaring melodies, heroic themes, and driving rhythms, this work is accessible while also providing exciting challenges for more advanced players. Inspired by the Zia sun symbol on the New Mexico state flag, this piece celebrates the strength and resilience of orchestra programs and their students during the global pandemic.

CHIMERA NO. 3 Wallace (D) • 67608



This programmatic work was inspired by a fire-breathing creature from Greek mythology, often depicted as part lion, part goat, and part serpent. It first presents itself as all of its parts, later transforming seamlessly into the three individual animals. The middle sections in the piece are a depiction of the different characteristics each animal

possesses. At the conclusion of the work, the theme returns, and the beast is back to its original form.

MOSHPIT SABBATH! Thomas (D) • 71524

The ultimate face-melting, string-breaking smash-fest, forever proving that strings rock! Inspired by the great metal bands of the 80s and 90s, this piece was written for strings and drums that features shredding riffs, epic chugs, metal licks, whammy bar wails, screaming glissandi, and wild electric guitar duets all for string orchestra! Optional electric violin soloists add even more intensity! Feature an awesome drummer or use the incredible pre-recorded track to bring the piece to life. Unlike anything else out there, this is the closer of all closers!
